


Talking

This historic tome illustrates the work of the surrealist writers and artists, Art et Liberté, who worked and resided in Cairo during the inception of the Second World War. The book is published in conjunction with the work showcased at the group's current exhibition at Centre Pompidou in Paris, which marks the first large-scale exhibition of its kind devoted to the subject. Featured is a series of the Egyptian modernists' paintings, photographs and archival documents from the late 1930s until the late 1940s.

Published to coincide with the exhibition Two Suns in a Sunset (derived from the French title, Se Souvenir de la Lumière) conceived by the Lebanese artists and filmmakers Joana Hadjithomas and Khalil Joreige. This monograph


illustrates over 1,000 images of the duo's work which includes documentaries, fictional films, photography, art installations and performances exploring narratives of alleged concealed events throughout Lebanon's history. OBAIDI: IN CONVERSATION WITH HANS ULRICH OBRIST

This hardcover features a survey of the artist, Mahmoud Obaidi's work which was published to accompany his current exhibition at Qatar Museums Gallery Katara, entitled Fragments: An Exhibition by Mahmoud Obaidi. Hans Ulrich Obrist introduces readers to Obaidi through a comprehensive interview with the Iraqi artist—addressing themes of transition, exile and loss. This tome showcases photographs of the large-scale sculptures commissioned for the Fragments exhibition. Particular highlights include the politically-charged Mosquito Effect and the Ford 71 bronze and steel installations which characterise the remnants of war-torn Iraq. Readers gain a retrospective of Obaidi's work spanning from literature and film to music and architectural projects which pay tribute to the artist's illustrious career. Edited by Tracy Goulding. THE PARACHUTE **PARADOX**

This profound memoir chronicles the life of the artist Steve Sabella who was born in Jerusalem's Old City and raised under Israeli occupation. "Life under occupation is like the reality of a Palestinian attached to an Israeli in a tandem jump," explains Sabella, as he refers to the metaphorical parachute tandem jump experience of departing on a plane from Israel. The artist traces his journey under occupation including living through two Intifadas, being kidnapped in Gaza and traversing between Palestinian and Israeli cultures throughout his life. BECOMING IRANIAN

This monograph chronicles the visual documentation of the photographer and writer Bijan K Roghanchi's journey throughout Iran during a period of over two years. Born and raised in the US of Iranian descent, Roghanchi

travelled to Iran in 2011 and provides a visual display of coming to terms with his heritage. Featured is a series of photographs from four generations of women in the Gilan province to the landscapes of Isfahan captured from a midnight train journey to Roghanchi's great grandfather's tomb in the holy city of Qom. This tome presents an intimate and fascinating insight into quotidian life in Iran.
